# Chocolate

## Wednesday's Art

### *Chocolate Snakes*

#### **Items Needed:**

- ✓ 1/2 C. Peanut butter
- ✓ 1/2 C. Dry milk
- ✓ 1/2 C. Honey
- ✓ 1 T. cocoa
- ✓ 1/2 t. vanilla
- ✓ 1/2 C. Chopped nuts (DELETE NUTS IF THERE ARE ANY ALLERGIES)
- ✓ 1/2 C. Raisins
- ✓ 2 T. coconut
- ✓ Wax paper
- ✓ Sandwich baggies

#### **Directions:**

Combine peanut butter and dry milk until blended. Stir in, one at a time, honey, cocoa, vanilla, nuts, raisins, and coconut. Give each child a scoop to place their mixture on wax paper and roll into a thick snake shape. Wrap in wax paper and chill. Send home that afternoon!

## Friday's Art:

### *Chocolate Portrait*

#### **Items Needed:**

- ✓ Melted chocolate chips
- ✓ Parchment paper
- ✓ Water

#### **Directions:**

Melt the chocolate and add some water to stop it from hardening too quickly. Give each child a piece of parchment paper and a scoop of the chocolate. Have them "finger paint" their chocolate. Let their design dry. Send home with a note that they can peel their design off the paper and eat for a snack!
